In 1929, the city of Chicago began reclaiming land from Lake Michigan, for the creation of lakefront parks, beaches, harbors and golf. It took three years of trucking in millions of tons of soil, to fill the areas currently east of Lake Shore Drive. The intent was to build an 18-hole golf course to be called Waveland. However, due to funding and cost overruns, only a nine-hole course opened. Waveland GC opened in 1932, at cost of \$2 million (\$34M today!). In 1991, the city renamed the course Sydney R. Marovitz, in honor of the former commissioner of the Park District Board.
